



I recently traveled to Vietnam. While I was in Hue, the cultural capital of Vietnam, a strange thought occurred to me: "Can I have Tintin in Vietnamese?" Before coming to Hue, I was in Ha Noi and stayed in the Old Quarter. I explored the whole place on foot, but didn't come across any bookstores. I wasn't actively looking either. Instead, over the weekend I was busy immersing myself in the amazing nightlife of the Old Quarter. When I found Tintin In Hue's book on my way to the Forbidden City, right on the Perfume River, I came across a large store owned by PNC, a major chain of books and stationery in Vietnam. I searched the shelves and found many translated manga titles, the most notable being Dragon Ball, Detective Conan, and Doraemon. There were also some native Vietnamese titles. PNC store in Hue. Many popular titles such as J.K. Rowling's Harry Potter, Steig Larsson's Millennium Trilogy, and Rick Riordan's The Olympics Saga were all available as translations. An entire aisle is dedicated to Dragon Ball. I bought the first volume in Vietnamese. Detective Conan - or what English speakers would know as Case Closed. Doraemon and India! I'm surprised no Hindi publisher has bothered to translate the Doraemon manga into Hindi. Couldn't find any Tintin titles (Vietnamese characters didn't help) so I looked up a picture of Tintin and showed it to the staff. He immediately recognized the image and asked, "Tintin?" I nodded and added, "Vietnamese." He disappeared and did not return for 15 minutes. I sat down for a coffee instead (they have a nice coffee shop and reading room). When he returned he had two books with him, Broken Ear and Cobra Valley. The latter is not a Tintin album. Despite this, the publisher included the Tintin and Snowy logo in the upper left corner. Speech ball sound effects (musical record) are preserved from the original Hyslop publication. There are leaves where you can see the Kmyk Plastina offset plate. This did not happen to Metuen's books, which I read in 1996, Ananda Publishers used thicker paper for printing, but they used terrible glue. CMYK plates mismatch on this page is the most prominent. It is also obvious that the source was not the original CMYK plate, because the black lines consist of four colors and do not have a special plate K. The back cover lists all the names that were published by that time. I doubt whether they are easy now. Tintin's album catalog is available at the sitetime of publication. I was more surprised to find only one album of each of the three double albums on the list. There's Destination Moon, but no explorers on the moon, Prisoners of the Sun, but no Red Rackham's treasure. However, a quick search on Tintinologist.org revealed that Vietnamese editions of these missing albums were indeed released.
